What is Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)? It might be easier to discuss what ABA is not... ABA is not *Discrete Trial Teaching*; however, Discrete Trial Teaching is designed *using the principles of ABA*. ABA is not about making individuals stop doing things they enjoy or find comforting. **ABA is about teaching socially significant behavior that will afford individuals increased opportunities for socialization, independence, and engagement in society.**

The Behavior Analyst Certification Board offers this definition of Applied Behavior Analysis, “a science based on the use of learning principles to improve lives. **The practice of ABA focuses on assessing the environmental influences on behavior, assessment-based intervention, and data-based decision making.**”
